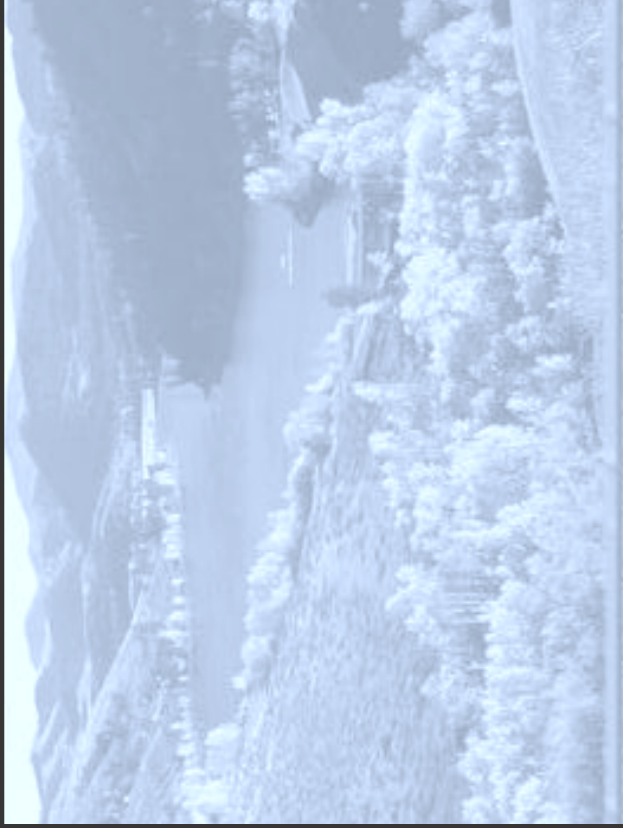

Directions

From the Seattle/Tacoma Area:

Take I-5 North to Everett or 522 to Monroe and take Stevens Pass, Highway 2, east to Wenatchee. Continue on Highway 2 following signs to East Wenatchee/Okanogan, crossing the Columbia River. Turn left at the junction with Hwy. 2/97 and continue north to Okanogan/Oroondo/Brewster/Pateros. This route follows the east side of the Columbia River and is a faster route than 97A. Continue on Highway 97 towards Okanogan bearing left at the junction at Oroondo where Highway 2 turns right to Spokane. Approximately 58 miles north of Wenatchee turn left at Pateros onto Highway 153 (20) to Winthrop. Drive approximately 31 miles west through Twisp and at about 6 miles west of Twisp, just past milepost 196, turn left onto Twin Lakes Road. 1.6 miles up Twin Lakes Road, turn left onto Patterson Lake Road and continue up past the lake for 6.4 miles to the Lodge.

From the East/Spokane

Drive west on Highway 2 through Reardan, Davenport and Creston to the junction with Highway 174 just west of Wilbur. Turn right at this junction, and proceed NE on 174 through Grand Coulee to Leahy and Bridgeport. Continue west on 173 past Chief Joseph Dam through Bridgeport, cross the Columbia River, to the junction with Highway 97 at Brewster. Turn left and follow Highway 97 down the west side of the Columbia River approximately 7 miles to Pateros. Just after crossing the bridge at Pateros, turn right onto Highway 153 (to 20). Drive approximately 31 miles west through Twisp and about 6 miles west of Twisp, just past milepost 196, turn left onto Twin Lakes Road. 1.6 miles up turn left onto Patterson Lake Road and continue up past the lake for 6.4 miles to the Lodge.

THE 2010 DEFENDER CONFERENCE FOCUSES ON EMERGING ISSUES IN CRIMINAL DEFENSE AND EXAMINES WHAT IS BEING DONE IN WASHINGTON STATE TO MEET THE PROMISES THAT WERE LAID OUT BY THE UNITED STATES SUPREME COURT IN 1963, ADOPTED BY THE WSBA IN 2007 AND AFFIRMED THIS YEAR BY OUR SUPREME COURT. THIS YEAR'S PROGRAM WILL FEATURE SPEAKERS AND TOPICS DESIGNED TO IMPROVE YOUR DEFENSE AND HELP FULFILL THOSE PROMISES.

- ♦ **INDIGENT DEFENSE** STEVEN WAX WILL SPEAK ON HIS WORK AS A PUBLIC DEFENDER WORKING FOR THOSE ACCUSED IN THE WAR ON TERRORISM AND HIS EXPERIENCES AS THE FEDERAL DEFENDER FOR OREGON. YOU CAN READ MORE ABOUT HIS WORK AT GUANTANAMO BY READING HIS BOOK, *KAFKA COMES TO AMERICA*.
- ♦ **TRIAL ADVOCACY** ANDY ROBERTSON WILL SPEAK ABOUT THE IMPORTANCE OF DEVELOPING THEORY AND THEME AND HOW TO GET A JURY TO LISTEN TO AND ACCEPT YOUR CLIENT'S STORY. CHRIS JACKSON AND MAGDA BAKER WILL SPEAK ABOUT USING THE WRIT PROCESS TO POSITIVELY IMPACT YOUR PRACTICE.
- ♦ **COMPETENT REPRESENTATION OF COUNSEL** THE ETHICS PROGRAM WILL FOCUS ON ISSUES RAISED IN *ANJ* AND *PADILLA*. WES RICHARDS WILL SPEAK ABOUT THE ETHICS OF REPRESENTING THE MENTALLY ILL, WHICH REQUIRES COUNSEL TO INVESTIGATE, RETAIN EXPERTS IF NEEDED, AND TO ESTABLISH A RELATIONSHIP WITH THE CLIENT. CINDY ARENDS AND AMY MUTH WILL ADDRESS PLEA NEGOTIATIONS AND INVESTIGATIONS. ANN BENSON WILL ADDRESS COMPETENT IMMIGRATION ADVICE IN LIGHT OF THE U.S. SUPREME COURT'S OPINION IN *PADILLA*.
- ♦ **FORENSIC EVIDENCE** THE INVESTIGATION TRACK WILL FOCUS ON THE NATIONAL ACADEMY OF SCIENCES REPORT AND HOW TO SHAPE YOUR CASES THAT INVOLVE FORENSIC SCIENCE. WE WILL HEAR FROM EXPERTS WHO EXAMINE EVIDENCE IN THE CONTEXT OF CRIMINAL CASES AND FROM PROFESSORS FROM SEATTLE UNIVERSITY WHO TEACH FORENSIC SCIENCE FROM A SOCIOLOGICAL AND SCIENTIFIC PERSPECTIVE.
- ♦ **MENTAL HEALTH AND MITIGATION EVIDENCE** SIMMIE BAER, DR. MARTY BEYER & KIM CRONIN WILL SPEAK ON HOW UNDERSTANDING BRAIN DEVELOPMENT, MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES, AND MITIGATION EVIDENCE CAN AFFECT YOUR CASE PREPARATION AND TRIAL STRATEGIES.
- ♦ **JUVENILE JUSTICE** TEAMCHILD'S JUVENILE TRACK WILL FOCUS ON ISSUES UNIQUE TO JUVENILE JUSTICE AND HOW UNDERSTANDING YOUR CLIENT'S CAPACITY CAN HAVE A PROFOUND IMPACT ON THE OUTCOME OF YOUR CASE.

TeamChild, the National Juvenile Defender Center, the MacArthur Foundation's Models for Change Initiative and WDA will sponsor a Juvenile Track for attorneys representing youth. This year the Juvenile Track will feature the MacArthur Foundation's newly released Juvenile Court Training Curriculum. There will be sessions on three of the five volumes: *Adolescent Development*, *Legal Questions about Youth's Capacities*, and *Communicating with Youth: Interviews and Colloquies*. There will also be a session on *Ethical Issues in Representing Youth*.

Nationally recognized attorneys and researchers including Simmie Baer (Northwestern School of Law), Dr. Marty Beyer, and Robin Walker Sterling (National Juvenile Defender Center) will make the presentations. STEVEN WAX IS IN HIS SEVENTH TERM AS THE FEDERAL PUBLIC DEFENDER FOR THE DISTRICT OF OREGON. A CUM LAUDE GRADUATE OF COLGATE UNIVERSITY AND HARVARD LAW SCHOOL, HE WAS A KEY PART OF THE BROOKLYN, N.Y. DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S PROSECUTION OF DAVID BERKOWITZ, A.K.A. "THE SON OF SAM." WAX AND HIS FEDERAL DEFENDER TEAM HAVE REPRESENTED SEVEN MEN HELD AS "ENEMY COMBATANTS" IN GUANTANAMO. HE HAS TAUGHT AT THE NORTHWESTERN SCHOOL OF LAW AT LEWIS AND CLARK COLLEGE, SERVES AS AN ETHICS PROSECUTOR FOR THE OREGON STATE BAR, AND LECTURES THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. WAX WAS BEEN HONORED FOR HIS WORK BY, AMONG OTHER GROUPS, THE NACDL, ACLU, FEDERAL BAR ASSOCIATION, AND AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE. *KAFKA COMES TO AMERICA*, WAX'S BOOK ABOUT HIS WORK REPRESENTING PORTLAND ATTORNEY BRANDON MAYFIELD AND THE MEN IN GUANTANAMO HAS WON FOUR NATIONAL AWARDS, INCLUDING THE PRESITGIUS ABA SILVER GAVEL.
